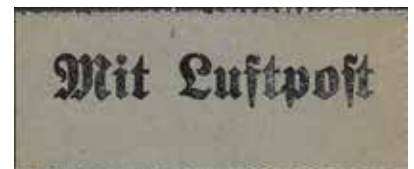

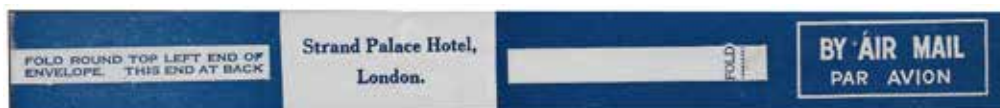

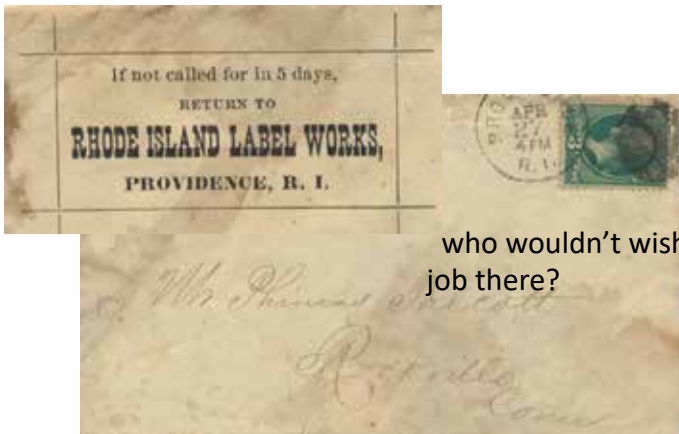

# Airmail labels

## Air Etiquettes of German Airlines

Art Groten

Considering the long and complicated history of the development of the German airline system, there are only two companies that issued airmail etiquettes: 1) Deutsche Luft Hansa during the Reich continuing into the post-war years as Lufthansa and 2) Interflug in the East. Other airlines that made up what became Lufthansa had air baggage labels but not airmail etiquettes.

The first DLH etiquettes were a set of 5 in different languages issued between 1934 and 1935. Those for use from Germany were in German and came first in blue during April 1934 and then in red in November, printed in sheets of 20. (Figure 1) The latter is known both with and without perforations. There followed, in 1935, those in Dutch, Belgian, English and Italian. (Figure 2) Their long horizontal rectangular shape is rather unusual as is its use on cover. (Figure 3)

In 1937, a more prosaic etiquette was released for use in Spanish speaking countries. It specified "Lufthansa" as the carrier. (Figure 4)

Lufthansa served both East and West Germany in the post-war period: one etiquette in the East, available in two color combinations (dark blue & yellow-orange or blue and yellow) from 1957 to the mid-1960s (Figure 5); in the West, four etiquettes released between 1959 and the 1990s. I can show two. (Figure 6)

The other airline that issued etiquettes was the East German Interflug with three designs from 1963 to the 1980s. (Figure 7)

After the 1990s, the etiquettes were either government or private issues.

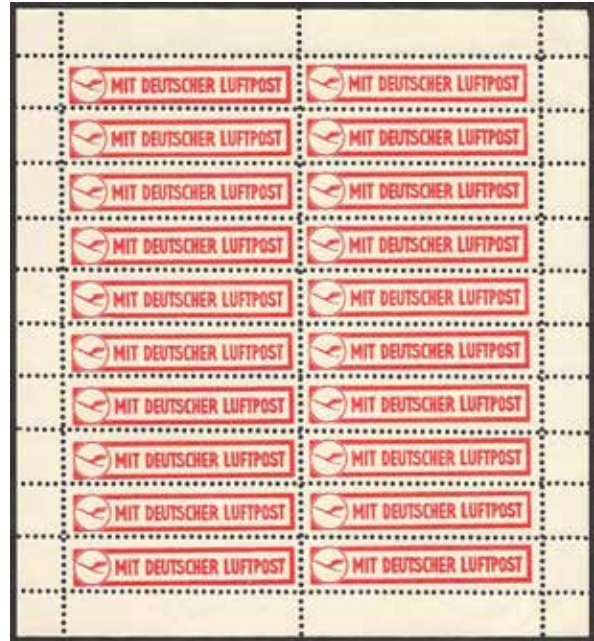

## Collecting getting slow? by Darus Greathouse

I started collecting stamps when I was about 10 years old. I am now over 72. I now have over 35 Minkus volumes (w interleaving pages and a large box of supplements). I have not added anything into this set for over 40 years. My interests have changed over the years. I am dabbling in revenues, perfins and precancels. For the last 15 years or so, postal labels of all kinds have caught my fancy. One does have realize one's space

limitations. Since postal labels are not always easy to find, I tend to branch out into related areas. Since I pour over boxes and boxes (\$1 covers, mostly), it is so easy to expand into new areas. Reasonably priced Hotel covers have drawn my notice.

Of course, any related postal (or any) label on a Hotel cover just draws my eye. To me, when the hotel label ties to the Hotel stationary, it adds spice to the cover.

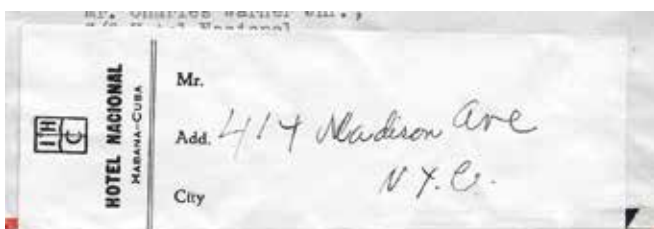

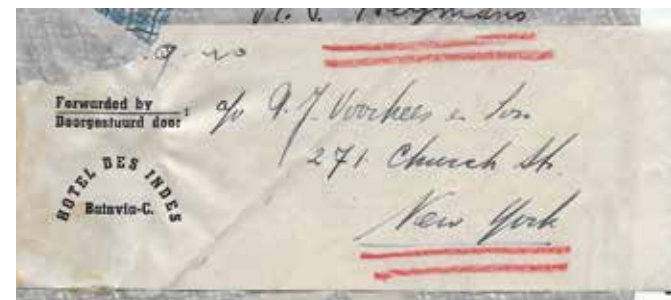

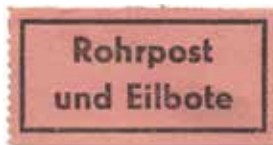

Who knows more about the blue label? It seems to indicate a special delivering service, but is it from a private company or from the Finnish postal service?



In several European cities a pneumatic postal service was available. And senders of letters used labels indicating their wish to use this service. But also in several American cities a pneumatic post service was present. However, I never came across an American label. Do they exist? (I'm afraid that the cover shown is rather suspect. The cancellation is from 1958 in Dassow, which is a small town in former East Germany; certainly without a pneumatic post facility.)



This is a cover from Pakistan, 1958. I know there is an endless variety of postal labels and in collecting one should limit oneself. But coming across a label like this I can't resist buying it. Who knows more?



I found another one, unfortunately a loose one without a cover, so I don't know from which country.

Route indications are mostly found as markings (see for instance Jan ter Welle's *Jusqu'a hand stamps and other route indications*), but occasionally a label is used. Who knows of other labels with this function?

a note from Jan ter Welle:

Occasionally I receive labels and/or information on Express labels not yet mentioned in my catalogue. This is very much appreciated by me and I hope one will continue with this kind of reactions.

More than once I received a copy of a Canadian 'special delivery' label to be presumed a new type (as for instance on the cover shown here). However (and unfortunately) this appears to be a part of an already documented label. Here is the complete label with all the different reference numbers I know of (page 47 in the catalogue):
